Introduction

The University of Lausanne is a higher teaching and research institution composed of seven faculties where approximately 14,300 students and nearly 3,900 collaborators, professors, and researchers work and study. Presentation

The Institute of Geography and Sustainability (IGD) seeks to fill two positions of Graduate Assistant, for a maximum period of 5 years. These positions are linked to the urban planning team led by Professor Jean Ruegg.

The IGD is an interdisciplinary community of about 100 academics that work on space, place and the environment. With 15 professors and close to 40 PhD students, the department offers a vibrant, stimulating environment for cutting-edge research. It hosts regular lecture series and distinguished guest researchers from around the world. The post is located in the research group *Urban Studies*, the largest of the institute's six groups.

Your responsibilities

The successful candidate will develop independent research leading to a PhD in the broad field of urban studies. She or he will enjoy considerable freedom in defining the topic of the thesis. It should, however, relate to one or more of the following themes:

- Private/Public land divide
- Privately owned spaces open to the public
- Lakeshore / Seashore land management.

The candidate will devote at least 50% of working time to her/his PhD research, with the remaining time reserved for supporting teaching and research in the IGD urban studies group as a graduate assistant.

Your qualifications

The successful candidate is expected to have earned a Master's degree in urban geography, urban studies, law (public/planning law), urban planning, political science, or a related field relevant to the post.

Expertise in qualitative methods and fieldwork is requested as well as an interest to translate STS (Science and Technology Studies) concepts and methods into the field of legal geography. Skills and commitment to work in an interdisciplinary group are required. French and English language proficiency is expected (French is the working language of the urban studies group at IGD as well as the teaching language at UNIL). Good command of German would be an asset.
